#### **HALLOWEEN THE CATHOLIC WAY - What is Halloween?**

"All Hallows Eve" is where the name of Halloween comes from. A hallowed person is another name for a saint. We call October 31<sup>st</sup> All Hallow's Eve because it is the eve of All Saints Day which November 1<sup>st</sup>.

The Mass that the Catholic Church celebrates on November 1st was called "Allhallomas". This meant mass of all the hallowed (saintly people)." It was commonly called "All Hallow's Day".

The night before Nov. 1st became known as Allhallowe'en, which was short for "evening before All Hallows' Day." It was then shortened to what we now know as Halloween.

#### Why do we celebrate All Saints' Day and All Souls' Day?

November 1st is a special day called the feast of All Saints. It is the day the Church celebrates with all the people who have died and are now with God in heaven. Everyone who has lived and died in Jesus' love is a saint. We do not know the names of all the saints. Some of these people were so much like Jesus that after they died, the Church said they were definitely in heaven, these people are formally recognised as saints by the Church.
