



#### **ADVENT**

Advent begins this Sunday.

Advent is a season observed in many Christian traditions as a time of expectant waiting and preparation for the celebration of Jesus Christ at Christmas. The word "Advent" comes from the Latin word "adventus", meaning "coming" or "arrival". It typically begins on Sunday closest to November 30, and lasts for four weeks, culminating on Christmas Eve.

During Advent, believers focus on the themes of Hope, Peace, Joy and Love, often symbolised by the lighting of candles on an Advent wreath. Each week, a new candle is lit, representing one of these themes, and a central Christ candle is usually lit on Christmas Eve.

Advent, according to Pope Francis, is a season of vigilance—a watchful waiting that transcends passive expectation and to cultivate a society where compassion reigns.
